Tracy Breuning : The Gut Bone Formation.

Under normal conditions, the skeleton is constantly remodelled and imbalances in this process may lead to low bone density and conditions such as osteoporosis. Current evidence is implicating alterations in the gut microbiome as a risk factor for poor bone health and joint inflammation. How the microbiome can affect organs distant from the gut is not well understood but is believed to occur through regulation of nutrition, regulation of the immune system, and/or translocation of bacterial products across the gut endothelial barrier. This talk will focus on these three areas then conclude with the latest research on the use of probiotics to support bone health.
